


5 things to know about Microsoft Reading Progress and Reading Coach

2 Customize

Customize assignment settings to best meet learners' unique needs by adjusting the number of attempts, setting a time limit, shifting pronunciation sensitivity, or toggling Reading Coach on or off to provide feedback.

3 Analyze

Explore data such as accuracy rate, accurate words per minute, or prosody on the most recent assignment or across the entire school year.
